NALCAB Announces Inaugural Class of National Latino Executive Leadership Program in Community Development Field

Year-long Fellowship will Focus on Culturally Relevant Understanding of Systemic Racism, Economic Inclusion and Leadership Strategies

(SAN ANTONIO, TX) - The National Association for Community Asset Builders (NALCAB) is pleased to announce the very first class of its new Latino Executive Advancement & Development (LEAD) Fellowship, a leadership development program exclusively for Latino CEOs, Presidents and Executive Directors at economic asset-building nonprofits that primarily serve Latino communities across the US. This year, 9 professionals were selected for this prestigious, executive level program presented in partnership with the Cisneros Hispanic Leadership Institute at The George Washington University (GW).

NALCAB's LEAD Fellowship is much more than understanding the fundamentals of leadership. The emphasis on community development through a Latino-focused lens allows participants the opportunity to expand their viewpoints and encourages collaboration to tackle multi-layered problems related to racial and economic equity, advancement and activism. LEAD Fellows will learn best practices for combating systemic racism and leadership principles that have deep connections to the work they do.

The thirteen-month fellowship includes curriculum focused on effective communication, cultural intelligence, organizational culture, critical thinking, and leadership theory. More information about the program can be viewed HERE.
