## NALCAB Announces 2024 Fellowship Class of National Latino Leadership Program

Culturally Relevant Training Prepares Next-Generation Latino Leaders in Community Economic Development

**(SAN ANTONIO, TX)** - The National Association for Latino Community Asset Builders (<u>NALCAB</u>) has selected the 2024 Pete Garcia Community Economic Development Fellowship class. The cohort of 22 up-and-coming professionals is the largest in the program's history.

Since its inception in 2010, the Fellowship has been a beacon of empowerment, designed to equip emerging Latino leaders with the practical, personal, and professional skills necessary to bridge the leadership gap that currently exists in the community economic development field. With a commitment to nurturing talent and fostering innovation, the program provides mid-career Latino professionals with culturally-relevant training, designed to prepare them for executive level roles within nonprofit organizations dedicated to serving Latino communities.

To date, the NALCAB Pete Garcia Fellowship has graduated 184 dynamic leaders from across the United States, representing 114 unique nonprofits spanning 26 states, the District of Columbia, and Puerto Rico. Through intensive training, mentorship, and networking opportunities, fellows emerge equipped with the vision, skills, and networks necessary to lead transformative change in their communities.
