Letter of Intent : Cracking the Federal Code Made Possible by The Truist Foundation Due on April 8, 2023 11:59 PT

Summary

Purpose

Federal funds can be a catalytic resource for nonprofits. Multiple large-scale federal opportunities are being released due to recent legislation targeting LMI communities. However, federal grant opportunities are often deployed through complex, competitive grants and require very technical skill sets to develop successful applications. Many nonprofits have the expertise to deliver these federal programs but not the time or resources to apply.

With the support of the Truist Foundation, NALCAB is launching a capacity-building program of grants and technical assistance to build the capacity of NALCAB members to access federal funding opportunities. NALCAB will provide awards of \$15,000, customized technical assistance, and training to approximately 20 organizations for this purpose.

In addition to the \$15,000 grant, NALCAB will also subsidize consulting services for the following type of technical assistance and capacity building activities:

- Research Federal Awards and Eligibility
- Forming Consortia
- Coordinate Joint Application
- Application Writing

Eligibility

Any 501(c)(3) community development or asset building organization is eligible to apply. Any organization that is awarded must be or become a current NALCAB member. To check your membership status, please contact NALCAB membership manager, Lexi Castillo, at <u>lcastillo@nalcab.org</u>.

*Projects focused on small business development, or a green/climate component will receive bonus points.

Requirements

Requirements for Grant recipients include:

- Designate a staff person to serve as project lead and communication liaison with NALCAB.
- Participate in a call within the first three weeks of project start date to discuss project activities and outcomes.
- Carry out activities described in proposal.
- Participate in at least 3 NALCAB webinars or trainings that will focus on best practices to address environmental issues, federal resources, or small business development or implementation of community-centered solutions.
- Submit interim and final reports describing program activities and outcomes, as well as programmatic
 data on clients served by the organization during the grant period. NALCAB will provide report
 templates to grant recipients prior to the start of the grant period.
- Potentially host NALCAB staff during a site visit (as needed and as budget allows) including designating key staff to meet with NALCAB, making presentations related to the planning effort, and giving a tour of the target community.
- Respond to all NALCAB surveys during the grant period.
- Participation in NALCAB's Annual Advocacy Event in Summer 2024 is highly encouraged, but not required.

To assist with these requirements, NALCAB will provide the following:

- A designated staff person to serve as main point of contact.
- Subsidized consultant support as needed
- Ongoing remote technical assistance to support project activities.
- Potential site visit (contingent on technical assistance needs of organization and budget availability) for in-person technical assistance.

- Templates for grant reports.
- Support for collaboration efforts.
